

Seizing holy opportunities

In *Holy Moments*, Matthew Kelly discusses the world's need for more small (but sometimes large) instances of people caring for others, cultivating joy, encouragement and love instead of anger, envy, fear. Kelly defines a Holy Moment as "a single moment in which you open yourself to God. … You set aside personal preference and self-interest, and for one moment you do what you prayerfully believe God is telling you to do."

This may mean mowing the lawn for a neighbor with a broken leg, praising a child on his artwork, buying a surprise snack for someone having a bad day, working extra shifts for a coworker with cancer so she can receive her full salary while out sick, paying for the next car's drive-thru order. Anyone can create a Holy Moment, because you don't need special skills, position or wealth. "If you want to see miracles, make yourself available to God," Kelly suggests.

He adds that God has a track record of collaborating with "the most unlikely people to make amazing things happen, and now He wants to collaborate with you." When we're open to God's leading, holy opportunities abound. And *we* will experience as much joy as the ones to whom we show care.





MICROSCHOOL LAUNCH SUB TASK FORCE UPDATE

The Administrative Board and the Vision Task Force have identified three initiatives that we believe God is calling us to pursue. These include 1) remodeling and expanding the Kitchen, 2) enhancing security measures during public events and 3) implementing a Christian Micro-school for parents who are looking for options beyond the public school system.

We have been reporting much on initiative #3 above through the work that is being carried out through the Microschool Launch Sub Task Force. We are pleased to report to you again this month. Jill Kilker and I were given the opportunity to promote Pharos Academy at this year's Eastern Regional Conference which occurred March 31 and April 1. We had a Pharos Academy information table on display at Conference and were given the opportunity to be a part of a discussion panel in front of the entire Conference regarding disciple-making. We were pleased to dialogue with many people who came to the information table and we appreciate having the opportunity to share Pharos Academy with the entire assembly during the discussion panel.

As we reported before, Pharos Academy plans to offer in-class instruction to students in grades K-6 two days a week. Students will receive instruction at home from their parents on other days. We are tentatively planning to designate Tuesdays and Thursdays as instruction days at the church. The Task Force also spent much time discussing tuition rates. At this point, we are planning to set tuition at \$4,500 per year per student. This figure is based on two factors. First, it represents the amount needed to support anticipated staff compensation. Second, it is the same rate set by another two-day hybrid Christian school located approximately 10 miles south of ECOG. Should we be able to lower that amount through some creative means (fundraising, budget adjustments, etc.) we know it would be a blessing to families considering Pharos Academy. Let's keep praying!

We are happy to report that Pharos Academy is now incorporated as a Limited Liability Corporation (LLC). McKenna-Snyder, LLC, a law firm that specializes in education legal services in Pennsylvania, facilitated the incorporation process. Pharos will use their services for other legal matters including designating the school as a 501c3 non-profit corporation.

April 7-10, Jill Kilker and I were privileged to attend a "Board Leadership" Seminar sponsored by the Herzog Foundation at the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library in Simi Valley, CA. The Reagan Library is an amazing place—we were so glad Herzog held the seminar there. We received a wealth of information regarding how to set up a school board for Pharos Academy.

On April 13, we held an Information and Promoters' Luncheon at ECOG immediately following the 10:30 AM Worship Service. We want to thank ECOG's Connectors Team for providing a fantastic lunch! We also want to thank everyone who came out to the lunch. It was encouraging to receive feedback from people who are excited to promote the school, pray for the school and even volunteer when it opens.

The Task Force approved a Statement of Faith for Pharos Academy. If anyone would like to see it, let me know and I can provide it for you. We anticipate having it on the website soon. At the

present time, the Task Force is working on several initiatives including creating an application for students, drafting by-laws, policies and procedures, establishing a school board, and other matters necessary to open the school. We have also started talks about the anticipated school staff. The current plan is for Jill Kilker to serve as part-time Head of School. We also anticipate hiring a part-time teacher, a part-time aid, and a part-time business director (to handle payroll and accounts payable). I will serve as the school's volunteer chaplain and spiritual director.

Please spread the word about an upcoming informational night for parents on May 4 at 7:00 PM. On April 24, we held the first Parent Informational Night in the Fellowship Hall. Everyone is welcome to the second one on May 4! If you have any questions about Pharos Academy, please feel free to direct them to any member of the sub task force which includes, Jeff Imboden, Julia Imboden, Pastor George Jensen, Jill Kilker and Kathy Liddick.
