Superimposed love

Maybe you've heard how salvation is like a total solar eclipse: God doesn't see our sins because Jesus' holiness covers them completely. Or maybe you've heard how trials can cause an "eclipse of faith."

At WorldChallenge.org, Pastor Gary Wilkerson explains that in Greek, *eclipse* means "I am absent" or "I cease to exist," because people once thought the gods temporarily extinguished the sun. "For Christians, a 'spiritual eclipse' is a dark hour when God seems to be absent from our lives," Wilkerson writes.

Wilkerson points to Peter being sifted like wheat, Elijah and Jeremiah facing extreme discouragement, and David collapsing morally. Amid Satan's attacks, "God seems completely absent," writes the pastor. "In that dark moment of eclipse, the devil has created such chaos we can't possibly see a way out." During times of testing, Christians must cry out to God and trust his faithfulness.

Completing the eclipse analogy, Wilkerson shares Titus 3:4, the "love of God our Savior appeared" (NIV). The Greek meaning of *appeared* here is *superimposed*, he writes. God looks on our fraught-filled times of eclipse and "superimposes his divine love over us."

a fun Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes



What you do:

- 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- 2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- 4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase.





Living discipleship

Christian theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who was hanged by the Nazis in April 1945, taught that Christianity and discipleship are intertwined. "Discipleship means adherence to Christ," he wrote in The Cost of Discipleship. "An abstract Christology, a doctrinal

system, a general religious knowledge ... render discipleship superfluous"



Bonhoeffer continued, "With an abstract idea, it is possible to enter into a relation of formal knowledge, to become enthusiastic about it, and perhaps even to put it into practice; but it can never be followed in personal obedience. Christianity without the living Christ is inevitably Christianity without discipleship, and Christianity without discipleship is always Christianity without Christ."

Following the 'Perfect Fool'

Theologian Frederick Buechner, who died at age 96 in 2022, explored how the "foolishness of God" (see 1 Corinthians 1:25) compares to human wisdom. He pondered the safety stickers that warn, "The life you save may be your own."

"That is the wisdom of [humans] in a nutshell," wrote Buechner. "What God says, on the other hand, is 'The life you save is the life you lose.' In other words, the life you clutch, hoard, guard and play safe with is in the end a life worth little to anybody, including yourself, and only a life given away for love's sake is a life worth living."

Buechner continued, "To bring his point home, God shows us a man who gave his life away to the extent of dying a national disgrace without a penny in the bank or a friend to his name. In terms of [human] wisdom, he was a Perfect Fool, and anybody who thinks [they] can follow him without [being] something like the same kind of a fool ... is laboring under not a cross but a delusion."

ECOG's Old Chairs Are Headed to Mechanicsburg and West Africa!!

Earlier this year, the Administrative Board decided to purchase new folding chairs for the Fellowship Hall. To avoid having to switch out the padded chairs with the metal folding chairs for various events, the decision was made to purchase 140 padded folding chairs. A few donors who wish to remain anonymous paid for the new chairs. No funds needed to be used from the General Fund. In order to make room for the new chairs and since many of the old chairs are no longer needed, the Board voted to gift another church or ministry with 40 of our padded chairs and 130 of our metal folding chairs.

The Mechanicsburg First Church of God asked for the 40 padded chairs. Mechanicsburg has a large classroom whose chairs are in disrepair. Our padded chairs will be used to replace them. We are delighted that one of our sister churches can make use of our padded chairs!

Churches of God pastor and military chaplain, Brent Mangus asked for the 130 metal chairs on behalf of one of his colleagues, Chaplain Edward Fornah. Several years ago, Chaplain Edward emigrated from Sierra Leone in West Africa and became a chaplain in the United States Army. In addition to serving as an army chaplain, Edward works tirelessly supporting a church planting movement back home in Sierra Leone. Chaplain Edward has been collecting tables, chairs, lecterns, sound systems and other items useful for church planting. He started out storing everything in Brent's basement but ran out of room. Now he's putting everything in a storage facility near Waynesboro, PA. This August, all these items will be loaded onto a ship in Baltimore and sent to Sierra Leone. A generous Christian donor is paying for the shipping. Chaplains Brent and Edward came to ECOG in late March, loaded 130 of our metal chairs onto a box truck and took them to that storage facility in Waynesboro where they await shipment to Sierra Leone along with all the other collected items. So, our metal chairs are headed to a church planting ministry in Sierra Leone, West Africa!

We thank God for the generosity of the anonymous donors who paid for ECOG's new padded folding chairs. We are also grateful for the opportunity to gift our old chairs to a local sister church and a church planting effort all the way over in West Africa! To God be the glory!


