During the Korean conflict, journalist Marguerite Higgins, a courageous and award-winning war correspondent, spoke with a young soldier shivering in the bitter cold. He was eating from a tin can, his face streaked with mud, when she asked, "If I could give you anything in the world you wanted, what would you ask for?"

The soldier paused for a moment, then answered quietly, "Give me tomorrow."

The King no one expected

Sometimes we speak—or even shout—the truth without realizing just how right we are. That’s exactly what happened on the first Palm Sunday.

Jesus entered Jerusalem not on a prize-worthy stallion, but on a young, humble donkey. The crowd erupted in joy, shouting, *“Hosanna! Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord!”* They waved palm branches, symbols of peace, and hailed Jesus as their king.

Was He a king? Jesus didn’t deny it. When the Pharisees told him to silence the crowd, he replied, *“I tell you, if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out.”*

Later, Pilate—the Roman governor—mocked the religious leaders by saying, *“Here is your king.”* The chief priests bristled with anger, shouting, *“We have no king but Caesar!”*

When Pilate handed Jesus over to be crucified, he made one last jab at the furious crowd. John 19:19 tells us he ordered a sign to be placed above the cross. Written in Hebrew, Latin, and Greek, it declared:

“Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews.”

The chief priests demanded the sign be changed, but Pilate refused. *“What I have written, I have written,”* he said.

Was Jesus a king? The witnesses of His resurrection knew the answer. In Acts 17:7, the early believers were accused of “saying there is another king, Jesus.” And the book of Revelation looks ahead to the day when all creation will know the truth:

“The Lamb will triumph ... for He is Lord of lords and King of kings.” — Revelation 17:14.

When Life Needs a Little Wind

Botanists say that trees need the powerful March winds to flex their trunks and main branches, so that the sap is drawn up to nourish the budding leaves.

Perhaps we need the gales of life in the same way, though we dislike enduring them. A blustery period in our fortunes is often the prelude to a new spring of life and health, success and happiness, when we keep steadfast in faith and look to the good in spite of appearances.





Policy on Payment of Camp Fees

1. The church will pay one half of the fee for Camp or Retreat at Camp YoliJwa once per calendar year when the form is submitted to the Lead Pastor for signature.
2. Persons eligible to ask for assistance would be members or attendees of ECOG; not their friends.
3. Payment will be made from the Camp Endowment Fund until there are no longer funds in the account on a first-come-first-serve basis.
4. Every March an article will be published in the newsletter stating the camp policy and encouraging contributions to the Camp Endowment Fund. The same article can be used each year. Anyone may donate to the Fund by making a check to ECOG and marking "Campers" on the memo line.

MICROSCHOOL LAUNCH SUB TASK FORCE UPDATE

On Monday, February 2, 2026, the Microschool Launch Sub Task Force met to at Enola First Church of God to continue getting things in order for the opening of Pharos Academy in 2026.

The paperwork to establish Pharos Academy's 501c3 non-profit status has been submitted to the PA Department of Revenue for state recognition. Work remains to make this a reality on the federal level.

We continue to raise funds through the "1-100 Wall Envelope Fundraiser" which will soon be moved upstairs in an effort to generate new interest. Donation envelopes continue to be used by some folks on a regular basis. Other fundraisers are being considered.

We reported last month that the Task Force looked into "Acton Academy," a nation-wide franchise modeled like what we envision for Pharos. Our thoughts were that it may be wise for us to have Pharos become an Acton Academy affiliate. After much review, the Task Force determined that it would NOT be wise for us to go in that direction.

The group discussed options for launching educational offerings, including a structured 2-day learning program and individual stand-alone classes. Key details to finalize include:

- Compensation models for teachers (e.g., hourly rates, per-class payments, or per-semester stipends),
- Pricing structures for both the individual classes and the full program,
- How to incorporate and account for H.O.P.E. ("Helping Our Parents Educate").

We will continue refining these ideas, along with associated costs and fees. By general consensus, the group agreed to start by offering stand-alone classes initially, with plans to introduce the structured 2-day program at a later stage as we build momentum and experience.


