A letter from Christ

Paul the Apostle gave a beautiful compliment to the believers in Corinth. He wrote:

“And you show that you are a letter from Christ delivered by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts” (2 Corinthians 3:3, ESV).

What a meaningful picture. A letter carries a message, and Paul reminded the church that their lives were sharing the message of Christ with others.

The same is true for us today. Through our words, actions and faith, people can see evidence of God at work in our hearts. None of us is perfect, but living faithfully can point others toward Him.

Music is one way to give thanks to God. Make these simple instruments to accompany your singing!

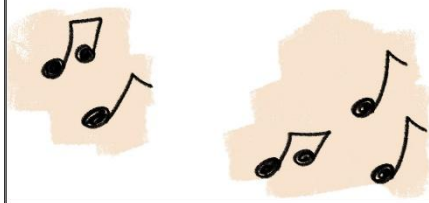
What you need:

Charging Forward in Stewardship

Rhinoceroses are remarkable creatures. Strong, sturdy and surprisingly fast, a rhino is built to protect. When it senses danger, especially near its herd or its young, it does not hesitate. It moves with focus, strength and purpose.

There may be a stewardship lesson for us in that.

God has entrusted each of us with gifts, time and resources to use for his kingdom. When opportunities come to serve, give, encourage or help, faithful stewards do not stand still and wait for someone else to go first. They respond with willing hearts and steady faith.

Stewardship is not passive. It calls us to move with purpose, give with conviction and serve with the strength God provides. May we be quick to answer God's call, bold in putting our faith into action and faithful in caring for the people and work God has placed before us.

Christian Symbol:

LAMP — In Bible times, lamps were small but essential sources of light, especially during the dark hours of night. Scripture often uses the image of a lamp to represent God's guidance, truth and wisdom. Psalm 119:105 says, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path," reminding believers that God's Word directs each step of life. Jesus' parable of the wise and foolish bridesmaids also connects the lamp with wisdom and spiritual readiness (Matthew 25:1-13). In addition, the lamp is sometimes used to symbolize the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and the gift of life itself. Because of these meanings, the lamp has become a lasting symbol of God's guidance, faithful living and the light of Christ shining in the darkness.

ESTHER – THE RIGHT TIME, PLACE AND REASON

At the 8:00 and 10:30 AM Worship Services this Fall, we are working our way through an 11-part message series entitled, “Esther – The Right Time, Place and Reason” based on the book of Esther. In this historical narrative, the Lord uses Esther and her cousin Mordecai to save His people in Persia from annihilation at the hands of a wicked man named, Haman. The key verse in this book consists of Mordecai’s advice to Esther – “If you keep silent at this time, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another place, but you and your father's house will perish. And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?” (Esther 4:14).

On a literary note, the Book of Esther is divinely crafted into an “inverted parallel structure” which means that it highlights a successive reversal of fortunes. Here are the themes and messages we will share from the book of Esther. Note the reversal of fortunes in this book’s literary structure as presented in the themes and messages we will cover. Note: A-E and E’-A’ emphasize the inverted parallel structure.

WEDNESDAY ADULT BIBLE STUDY

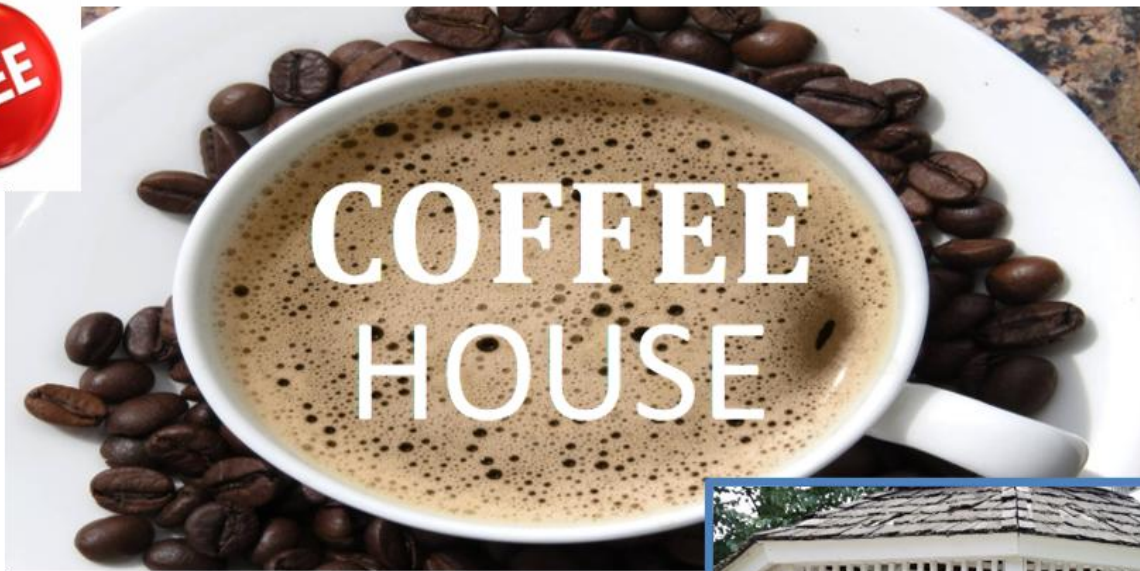

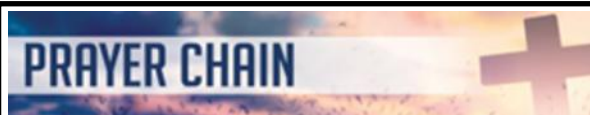

If you're reading this notice and didn't realize we had a prayer chain and would like to be part of the praying community, please contact Amy Kreiger at one of the above options to be added to the list.

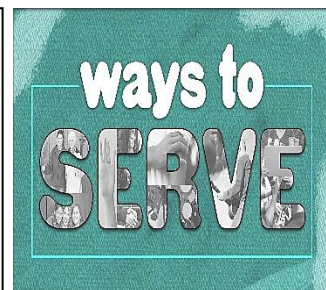

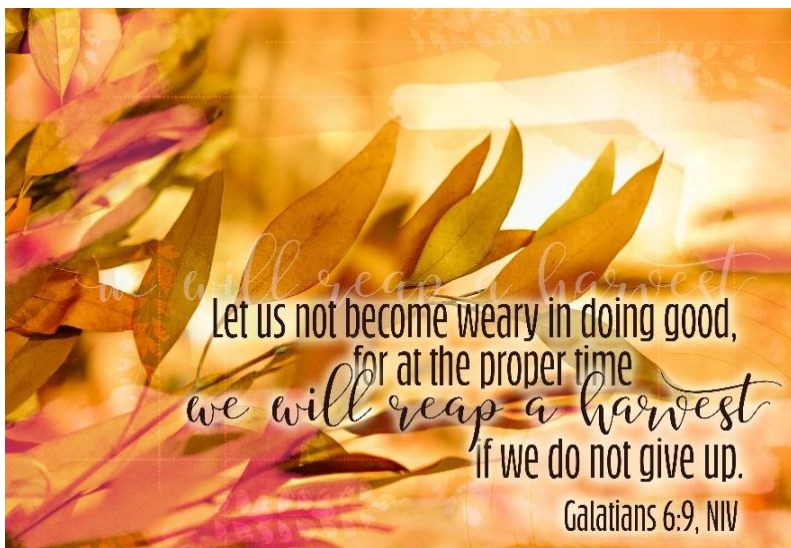
JEFF STEINBERG

Ways to Give to ECOG
