Fixer-uppers

Summer is peak time for home renovations and remodeling projects. Those can be super stressful, starting with the selection of a contractor.

In a blog about her own family's construction plans, Laura Elliott explains the challenge: "It's not just any builder I want. I want one who has impeccable workmanship, is completely trustworthy and delivers our long-awaited [projects] early and under-budget." After sifting through bids and reviews, she discovered that most builders "look like they do pretty similar work for a pretty similar price."

For spiritual renovations, however, the choice is clear. "God is the builder of everything," says Hebrews 3:4 (NIV). Elliott writes, "Jesus is not only the builder of His Father's house, but He is the buyer, and the heir as well." And what he's building, she adds, is "a better Bride," his church.

Faith upgrades are an ongoing, lifelong process. "The renewal of our natures is a work of great importance," said 18th-century minister George Whitefield. "It is not to be done in a day. We have not only a new house to build up, but an old one to pull down." It's a good thing God oversees this project!

Sermon Series

SUMMER TRAINING



We are continuing the message series, "Summer Training" which focuses in on biblical spiritual disciplines. Dr. Don Whitney, Professor of Biblical Spirituality at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in

Louisville, KY says, "The spiritual disciplines are those practices found in Scripture that promote spiritual growth among believers in the gospel of Jesus Christ. They are habits of devotion, habits of experiential Christianity that have been practiced by God's people since biblical times." In 1 Corinthians 9:24-25, the Apostle Paul writes, "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever."

Pastor Jensen has been calling attention to the challenge of spiritual apathy that seems to be pervading churches everywhere in our time. Referring to it as a "spiritual malaise," he has also referred to those who fall prey to it as "malaisers." Spiritual disciplines can help believers avoid and even come out of this pervasive and unhealthy spiritual malaise. Below is a list of the remaining spiritual disciplines, messages and Scriptures we will cover in this "Summer Training" message series.

Simplicity: "Keep it Plain and Simple" – Matthew 6:33; Philippians 4:11-13

Solitude: "Try 'ENOLA' Spelled Backwards" – Psalm 46:1-11

Submission: "This Sub Needs 'Let Us'" – Ephesians 5:21; James 4:7-8

Service: "Can We Get Some Service?" – 1 Peter 4:10


GIDEONS SUNDAY August 3, 2025
