





AMOS: A WAKE-UP CALL FROM GOD

Pastor Jensen will continue the Amos message series at the 8:00 and 10:30 AM Worship Services through February and March. The book of Amos is relevant to our world today. It offers prophetic warnings against the practices of idolatry, greed and oppression. Amos addresses God's enemies, but he really zeroes in on speaking to God's people, Israel. In our world today, God's enemies and His people, especially His people,

need to "wake up" and repent of the wickedness that God abhors and embrace justice and righteousness which are the foundation of His throne. This is the essence of Amos's wake-up call from God. 

Love makes us worthy

Unlike God, who loves unconditionally, humans often make choices and set limits when doling out affection. But Thomas Merton reminds us, "Our job is to love others without stopping to inquire whether or not they are worthy. That is not our business and, in fact, it is nobody's business. What we are asked to do is to love, and this love itself will render both ourselves and our neighbors worthy."



As for how to develop and maintain that type of love? Merton shares, "It is in deep solitude that I find the gentleness with which I can truly love my [neighbors]."

Kindness kickbacks

Random Acts of Kindness Day, observed each year on February 17, is a reminder of the power of altruism. Followers of Jesus express kindness selflessly, out of love for God and our neighbors. Yet in return, we reap emotional — and even physical — benefits.

Researchers have identified a "helper's high" that can ease anxiety and depression. Spontaneous or planned acts of "pro-social spending" have been shown to reduce blood pressure, improve heart health, reduce pain and even extend longevity.

For maximum impact, experts recommend getting creative with random acts of kindness and mixing them up. But no matter how you spread kindness, you're bound to experience blessings in return!

A Lamplighter Devotion:

It is the Lord!

Thomas answered and said unto Him, My Lord and my God. John 20:28.

"Give Me to drink." How many of us are set upon Jesus Christ satisfying our thirst when we ought to be satisfying Him? We should be pouring out now, spending to the last limit, not drawing on Him to satisfy us. "Ye shall be witnesses unto Me"—that means a life of unsullied, uncompromising, and unbribed devotion to the Lord Jesus, a satisfaction to Him wherever He places us.

Beware of anything that competes with loyalty to Jesus Christ. The greatest competitor of devotion to Jesus is service for Him. It is easier to serve than to be drunk to the dregs. The one aim of the call of God is the satisfaction of God, not a call to do something for Him. We are not sent to battle for God, but to be used by God in His battlings. Are we being more devoted to service than to Jesus Christ?





MICROSCHOOL LAUNCH SUB TASK FORCE UPDATE

The Administrative Board and the Vision Task Force continue to work together to dialogue about where God may be leading our congregation. The leadership identified these areas as initiatives that God may be calling us to pursue. These include 1) remodeling and expanding the Kitchen, 2) enhancing security measures during public events and 3) implementing a Christian Micro-school for parents who are looking for options beyond the public school system.

At this point, we can provide an update pertaining to area #3. That's why this month's update regarding the vision is a "Microschool Launch Sub Task Force Update." Late last year, the Administrative Board established this sub task force to oversee the launch of the microschool. As we reported in the January 2025 edition of <u>The Sonshine News</u>, our Christian microschool will be a campus of "The Samuel School" located in New Cumberland, PA. Feel free to look in the January 2025 edition of the newsletter to learn about the educational model of our campus. In January, the sub task force proposed naming our campus, "The Samuel School – Enola Campus." The Samuel School (main campus) has approved this name. Therefore, we can now confirm that is what the name will be.

The Sub Task Force met on January 20 to talk about fundraising and promotion along with mission, vision and core values.

FUNDRAISING

The Sub Task Force invited Nate Cook to come as a guest to the meeting to give insights about the PA Earned Income Tax Credit initiative (EITC). Nate has knowledge about EITC through his position at Pennian Bank. Banks and financial institutions tend to be amenable to supporting educational endeavors through the EITC initiative. The Task Force is grateful to Nate for the information he shared. Any PA business or individual can participate in EITC. Therefore, the Task Force agreed to do the following: Each member of the sub task force will pray over and review the church directory to see if there may be church attendees who have connections with financial institutions and/or businesses that may have EITC funds to donate. Members will e-mail the Sub Task Force recording secretary (Julia Imboden) with those names. Then, they will formulate a way to work with those individuals to approach such financial institutions and businesses about participating in the EITC program naming "The Samuel School – Enola Campus" as the beneficiary.

PROMOTION OF "THE SAMUEL SCHOOL – ENOLA CAMPUS"

The following steps will be taken to promote the campus: Contacting other churches in our area to give information and details about the microschool, having an informational table at Eastern Regional Conference in Session (March 31-April 1), creating a flyer with details about the school, giving information to The Samuel School (main campus) to get a website active, and utilizing our own website to provide information and F.A.Q's about the school and the work of the sub task force.

MISSION, VISION AND CORE VALUES STATEMENTS

The following statements were proposed subject to approval by The Samuel School (main campus) and the Administrative Board of the Enola First Church of God:

Mission Statement

Partnering with parents to provide academic rigor and mentoring, while deepening students' relationships with Christ, developing a Biblical world view, and pursuing goodness, truth, and beauty in a loving church environment.

Vision Statement

Preparing students to, "honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense for the hope that is within," (1 Peter 3:15) while loving and impacting the world for God.
