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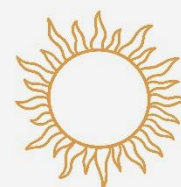

It Is No Secret: A Song Born of Transformation

Billy Graham's public ministry gained national attention at the Rose Bowl in 1949, where a remarkable response marked the beginning of a historic movement. He returned to the same venue in November 2004, 55 years later, to commemorate that milestone.

Before the 1949 event, Billy appeared as a guest on a radio show hosted by songwriter and performer Stuart Hamblen. During the broadcast, Hamblen encouraged listeners to attend the meetings at the Rose Bowl. Before leaving, Billy invited Hamblen to attend as well. Though not a Christian at the time, Hamblen agreed. (His wife, however, was a believer.)

That evening, Hamblen did not go forward with others to profess faith in Christ, but he left deeply unsettled. Later that night, he went to Graham's hotel, where he shared his restless spirit. Through Billy's witness and prayer, Hamblen gave his life to the Lord.

Soon after, actor John Wayne asked him, "Stuart, what's this about you hitting the sawdust trail?"

Hamblen replied, "That's no secret, John, what God has done for me. He can do it for you or anyone else."

Wayne responded, "That sounds like a song. Why don't you write one?"

And so, "It Is No Secret (What God Can Do)" was born.

Hamblen later wrote many Gospel songs, once saying, "I try to write music with a spiritual uplift instead of a moral downbeat."

Who was Bartholomew?

Among the twelve disciples, Bartholomew remains one of the more intriguing figures, known more through connections than detailed accounts. Though he is not named in the Gospel of John, many scholars believe he is the same person as Nathanael, who appears only in John's Gospel.

This connection is often made because Philip introduces Nathanael to Jesus in John, while Bartholomew is consistently listed alongside Philip in Matthew, Mark and Luke. When Nathanael meets Jesus, the Lord declares, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no deceit!" (John 1:47, NKJV).

Outside of Scripture, early church historian Eusebius provides one of the earliest references to Bartholomew's ministry. He records that Bartholomew brought a Hebrew version of Matthew's Gospel to believers in India. Tradition also holds that Bartholomew preached in regions such as Mesopotamia, Persia, Egypt and Armenia.

His death is remembered as a martyrdom. According to longstanding tradition, Bartholomew was either beheaded or flayed alive and then crucified upside down. His life and witness reflect bold faith and enduring commitment to the Gospel.

Sermon Series



A BALLAD FOR A NEW SCHOOL YEAR

This August, Pastor Jensen will present a 4-part mini message series entitled, 'A Ballad for a New School Year.' Later this August, students will be going back to public and Christian schools. Some will be headed to college. Home school students will also be cracking the books. This school year is unique at Enola First Church of God since we anticipate opening Pharos Academy, a Christian microschool designed to provide H.O.P.E. for homeschool families. What does "H.O.P.E." stand for? It's "Helping Our Parents Educate." Regardless of whether parents are homeschooling their children or sending them to Christian or public schools, it is their duty primarily and the church's secondary duty to educate and raise students up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. The mini message series will focus on where we are in terms of educating and discipling students and how we need to move forward. The four message titles in the series uniquely form a ballad (in English class you'd learn that a ballad is a poem that tells a story!). We will have a special school prayer focus with each message. Since August 30 is the day before the opening of Pharos Academy, we will pray for homeschool students and Pharos Academy's kick off. Pharos Microschool Launch Task Force Update – July 2026

The Pharos Microschool Launch Task Force met on Wednesday, July 1, 2026, to review progress and prepare for the upcoming school year. The meeting opened and closed with prayer, reflecting the group's commitment to building a Christ-centered learning community.

Fundraising Momentum

Several initiatives are underway to support the new microschool. The 1-100 Envelope Fundraiser wall remains active, with expectations that participation will increase once classes begin. Upcoming and recent events include:

- A Senator's Game Fundraiser on July 24, where Pharos will receive \$4 for each ticket purchased (seven tickets sold to date).
- We have the results from the June 10 Texas Roadhouse fundraiser. We raised \$210.69 for Pharos through this endeavor.
- Another Texas Roadhouse event is planned for August, this time paired with a bake sale.
- A sandwich sale with R&K Subs has been postponed until fall so students and families can participate.
- Generous ongoing support includes homemade pies and handmade jewelry donations, both enthusiastically approved for fundraising efforts.

Administrative and Compliance Progress

Significant behind-the-scenes work continues:

- The application for federal tax-exempt status (Form 1023) is moving forward after signing an engagement letter with professional support. Estimated cost is approximately \$1,700.
- Key policies were approved, including a Child Protection Background Check Policy, Disclosure Statement, and requirements for Sexual Abuse Prevention and Reporting Training. Clearances will be renewed every five years, and these documents will be posted on the website.
- An updated Non-Employee Teacher Contract was approved (adjusted to 28 weeks).
- The Code of Conduct received refinements, including updated procedures for student issues and new language emphasizing high moral standards, Biblical consistency, and refraining from dissension.
- Handbook revisions are in progress, particularly around refunds, fees, deadlines, and a new School Cancellation Policy

On the operations side, Excel workbooks are now in use for accounting tracking. Payroll services will be evaluated through a professional provider when needed, with flexible options for contract employees in the interim. A dedicated Pharos bank account is being established, along with plans for online giving through Vanco. Website improvements are also being explored, with a volunteer offer under consideration.

School and Program Updates

Preparations for opening day are advancing steadily:

- Classes are expected to go live on the website around mid-July.
- A current list includes 13 classes serving various age groups.
- The school calendar was reviewed: Classes begin Monday, August 31, with 28 weeks total (14 weeks per semester).

The group discussed welcoming families who are not currently active in a Christian church community. Families will be asked to agree to the Statement of Faith, with an opportunity to note any disagreements. The website language has been updated to encourage active participation in a Christian church rather than requiring it, ensuring alignment between policy and practice.

Financial Snapshot

As of June 30, 2026, Pharos funds total \$19,264.56.

Looking Ahead

The next Task Force meeting is scheduled for July 20 at 6:00 PM. Items for continued discussion include finalizing the school calendar, classes, applications, fees, and advertising.

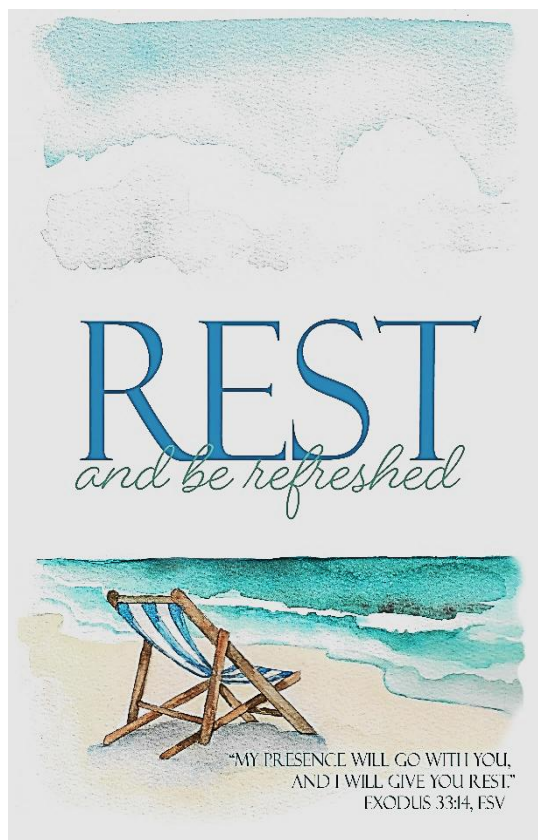
2026 Sanctuary Flowers

Kidney for Cindy

Have you ever, will you now, would you, if the time presents itself in the future, consider becoming a Living Kidney Donor?

My name is Cindy Marrow, a 25-year plus member of ECOG. Diagnosed with Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) in 2014, I can say with unequivocal doubtlessness the good Lord has not forgotten nor forsaken me as CKD progressed to End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) 2025.

Kidney failure has led to my reliance on a machine to do what damaged kidneys can't do, - keep me alive. Although I am thankful for dialysis, twice weekly treatments have ill effects on the body, and hopeful expectations on any given day have their unpredictability.

My Care Journey with UPMC Transplant Program began 02/2026. A couple of "bumps" caused candidacy concerns with Transplant Care Team but "The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much." His Will reigns! Approved for placement on the kidney transplant waiting list 06/2026, now I wait. I wait for The Call, return the call within an hour (or forfeit a kidney), and pray for a synchronous transport of the matched kidney, one that will afford me a life without dialysis and a wellness not had for over a decade.

A deceased kidney donation is a 5-7 year wait with a 5.5-10-year life span. A Living Kidney Donor, though, allows for a shorter time on the waitlist, longer life span, dismisses the chance of serious health problems discounting future candidacy (reevaluated yearly), even death.

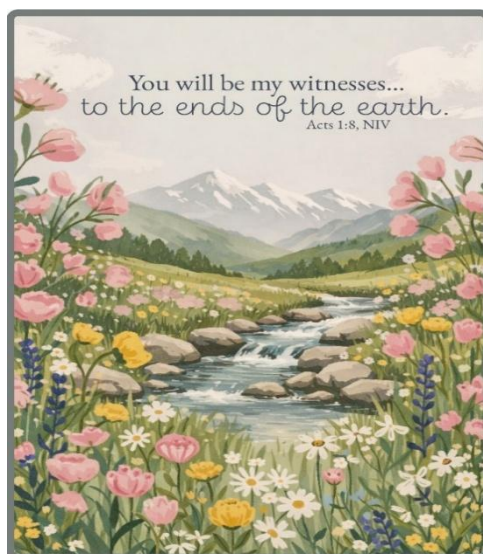

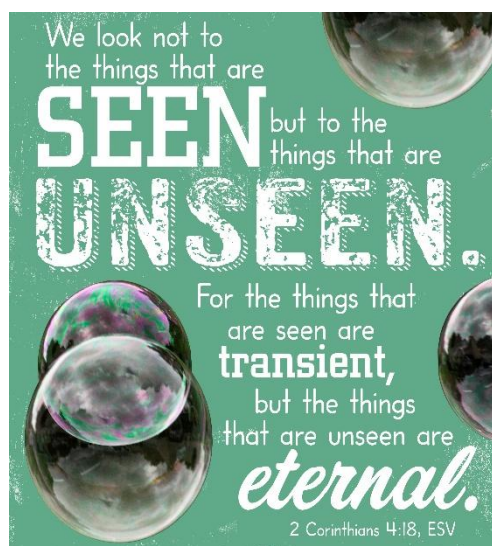
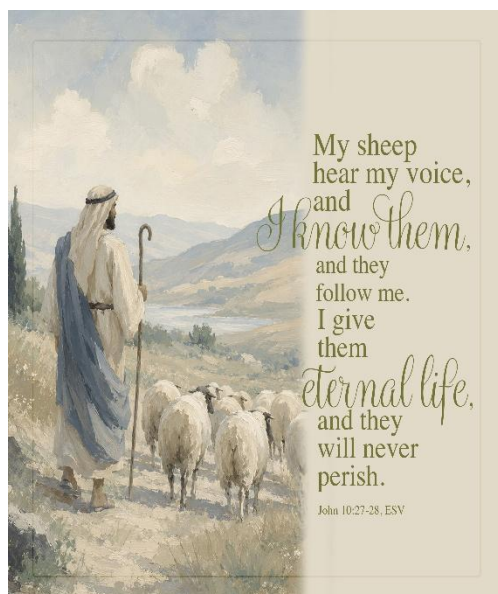
