What you need:


- Graham cracker squares or sugar cookies

The Foundation of Our Faith

Jesus' resurrection is the very foundation of Christianity. If Christ had never been raised from the dead, we'd have no Christian faith.

God's power was at work in Christ's death and resurrection. "It was on the resurrection fact that the church was built," said New Testament scholar James Stewart.

Paul understood that the resurrection was the bedrock of our faith: "And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:14, ESV). He continued, "And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins" (1 Corinthians 15:17, ESV).

The resurrection proves that Jesus is Lord and Savior. Its authenticity means that by faith in Christ, we are reconciled with God.

Billy Graham said the risen Christ is the bridge between us and God: "One of Christ's hands holds the hand of God; his other hand holds ours."





"TIMELY TOPICS FOR THE NEW YEAR"

Sermon
Series



In January, the Sunday morning message series will strive to address some "Timely Topics for the New Year" from a biblical perspective. Below is a summary of four topics that we will cover this series along with some other pertinent information.

January 4 – False Versus True Christian Unity

Meditation: "Christian Unity: What it is and isn't" – John 17:20-23; 2 John 1:9-11

During our Ordinance Services where we focus on the unity that believers share, we will look at the difference between so-called "unity" that is contrary to Scripture versus true Christian unity that the Lord Jesus Himself prayed for. Pastor Jensen noted of a recent meeting between Pope Leo XIV and Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew I of Constantinople regarding the Nicene Creed, an historic Christian confession of faith. One major goal of this meeting was to foster unity among Roman Catholics and Eastern Orthodox. This caused our pastor to ask, "Biblically speaking, what is the true unity that Jesus prayed for concerning genuine disciples?" That is the issue we will address.

January 11 – Human Trafficking

Message: "Human Trafficking and the Christian Response"

This Sunday will be the first time we gather following the Epiphany of or Lord (which is January 6). Another meaning for "epiphany" is "an illuminating discovery." It may be an "epiphany" for many to learn about a terrible scourge happening across our land – human trafficking. It is even a problem in our area. We are inviting Pastor Greg Hench from the Carlisle First Church of God to come and speak on what the Christian response to human trafficking should be. Pastor Hench is passionate about this matter and devotes much time to alerting Christians to it and how to respond.

January 18 – Immigration and Borders

Message: "Blessing Sojourners and Sustaining Borders" - Deuteronomy 24:14-22, Romans 13:1-7

In commemoration of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Many churches designate this Sunday as Human Relations Sunday. The questions and the debates in our nation go on and on about legal and illegal immigration, the border, and related matters. We will look at what the Bible has to say about these matters – in particular, the roles of the government and the church in addressing them.

January 25 – The Sanctity of Human Life Sunday

"Stand Up for Life Though Many Stand By" – Deuteronomy 30:19-20; Proverbs 24:11-12

On this Sanctity of Human Life Sunday, we will talk about the Biblical call for all believers to champion a wholistic view of human life. The lives of all people, including those yet to be born and the elderly are precious to God. However, it appears that churches are less willing to address this matter than they were just a few years ago. It is time for all followers of Jesus to be champions for life.





MICROSCHOOL LAUNCH SUB TASK FORCE UPDATE

On Monday, December 8, 2025, the Microschool Launch Sub Task Force met to prepare for the opening of Pharos Academy in 2026.

This fall, we reported here in The Sonshine News that the task force was trying to find out if Pharos Academy would be eligible to obtain money through the PA state Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program. In November, Jill Kilker posed our question to a representative from The Children's Tuition Fund (an EITC scholarship organization). That representative, who is very knowledgeable with the program, revealed that Pharos Academy students are not eligible to receive scholarships through EITC. The reason is that home school students are not eligible for EITC scholarships according to Pennsylvania law. As you may recall, all students at Pharos Academy will be coming to us as home school students. While Pharos will provide instruction to students two days per week and equip parents to educate their children, students will still be registered as home school students. Without the aid of EITC funding, the current model for Pharos Academy is not feasible, financially speaking. Some may ask, "Then why not open a private school and register them as school students? Then you can get EITC funding!" The steps involved in opening a private school in Pennsylvania are complicated and daunting. More importantly, we are convinced that God is calling Pharos to help parents educate their children as home school students. If we were to change over to a private school model, we feel we would not be fulfilling the calling that God has given to us.

The question now becomes, "So what do we do? Do we abandon moving forward with this part of the vision?" The Task Force believes we can still accomplish the calling God has given us by tweaking Pharos Academy's structure to a financially feasible model without the aid of EITC funds. What will that look like? Right now, we cannot answer that question because we are in a research and discovery phase. Please be in prayer that the Lord will continue to show us the way forward. We are convinced, as always, that God will accomplish the work He has begun so long as we are obedient and follow his leading.

We continue to move forward with establishing Pharos Academy's 501c3 non-profit status. We may be able to accomplish this through an accountant rather than a legal firm. That would be a cost-saving benefit for sure. Pray that God will lead us to the right accountant knowledgeable in this area. We are still inviting everyone to participate with Weis Markets in the "Weis 4 School" fundraising initiative and the "1-100 Wall" fundraiser located in the Fellowship Hall (see the related article on p. 11).






