



- Brown paper lunch bag
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Glue stick
- Jellybeans

- From the bag's bottom, cut two
 2-inch circles. Set aside.
- 2. From the sides, cut two 10-inch circles.
- Draw a thin spiral on each large circle and cut along the lines. Crinkle spirals gently.
- Starting at the center, wrap one spiral into a nest. Glue every few inches to hold it.
- 5. Glue one small circle to the bottom of the nest.
- 6. Repeat with the other spiral. Fill nests with jellybeans and give to a friend!

Creation care

Sir Robert Baden-Powell, who founded the Boy Scouts, asked troop members to "leave this world a little better than you found it." For Christians, that aim is rooted in Scripture.

Using a Bible-like parable, biology professor Michael Duncan writes: "Imagine you owned a property and rented it out to tenants for a period of time. Upon move-in, the tenants found the place clean and in perfect working order. As the owner of the property, it is your desire to see that the tenants regard the condition of the property and live in such a way that does not destroy the house. This is the mindset that we should adopt as tenants living on the earth."

Almost five centuries ago, John Calvin encouraged creation care too. "The earth was given to man, with this condition, that he should occupy himself in its cultivation," he wrote. "Let him who possesses a field, so partake of its yearly fruits, that he may not suffer the ground to be injured by his negligence, but let him endeavor to hand it down to posterity as he received it, or even better cultivated. Moreover, that this economy, and this diligence, with respect to those good things which God has given us to enjoy, may flourish among us; let everyone regard himself as the steward of God in all things which he possesses."

The Power of His Word

The word of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. 1 CORINTHIANS 1:18 (NASB)

Have you experienced the power of God's Word in your life? Have you seen how the Father uses it to sustain your soul and transform your life? It's not only when He heals a disease or provides for your needs in a supernatural way that He's active on your behalf. Often the greatest miracles He does involve breaking you free of strongholds and destructive behaviors.

However, realize that God releases His miraculous truth in your life not only to liberate you but also as a testimony to those who don't know Him. Your unsaved loved ones see the Savior's power in your life and it inspires them to believe in Jesus and be saved.

So as you spend time in Scripture and faithfully testify of God's love, look for ways He exhibits His power in your life. Ask the Father to use you mightily as His representative to those around you. And then watch as He uses His Word to work miraculously through you.



Did you know that ECOG offers two ministries to adults with intellectual disabilities? Here is what we have to offer:

"The Ice Breakers Class" – A Sunday School class which meets at 9:15 AM every Sunday morning in Room #5 on the Lower Level. The Ice Breakers' goal is to "break the ice" and make people feel welcome. Class sessions include singing, a Bible lesson, coloring and storytelling.

"The Sonshine Crew" – A Fellowship Group which meets in the Sanctuary at 7:00 PM on Wednesday evenings throughout the school year. The Sonshine Crew consists of a fine "crew" of folks who want to shine for Jesus. Group activities include karaoke, worship, Bible skits, a Bible lesson review, and a Bible quiz time.

MICROSCHOOL LAUNCH SUB TASK FORCE UPDATE

The Administrative Board and the Vision Task Force have identified three initiatives that we believe God is calling us to pursue. These include 1) remodeling and expanding the Kitchen, 2) enhancing security measures during public events and 3) implementing a Christian Micro-school for parents who are looking for options beyond the public school system.

Initiative #3 above continues to be primary focus the Administrative Board and the Vision Task Force. The bulk of the effort given to this area of focus has been carried out by a Microschool Launch Sub Task Force. Please feel free to check prior editions of The Sonshine News for previous updates.

As we reported to you before, the goal is to start a hybrid Christian classical microschool where students receive instruction both in school at ECOG from teachers and at home from parents. At this point, the plan is to have students spend two days per school week in class and the other three at home. We also established that for the first year, we will welcome students in grades K-6. In the future, we hope to expand that welcome to other grades. While students are in school, multiple grades may be grouped together while subject matter is adjusted accordingly. This model of education has proved to be effective. The tentative date for opening is September 2 of this year.

The million-dollar question out there is, "What is the school's name?" We are delighted to announce that the school's name will be, "Pharos Academy." Please see the article, "Pharos Academy" on p. 11 of this edition of <u>The Sonshine News</u> to learn why this is the ideal name for our school. You can also go to www.Pharosacademy.net or the Facebook page, "Pharos Academy" for more information about Pharos Academy.

To anyone out there who is interested in helping to promote Pharos Academy or simply find out more information, we invite you to come to a luncheon on Sunday, April 13 at 11:45 AM in the Fellowship Hall. See the article, "Microschool Promoter and Info Luncheon" on p. 16. The lunch will be provided by ECOG's Connectors Team (thank you, Connectors!) and members of the Launch Sub Task Force will give a brief presentation. If you have questions, this will be your opportunity to have them answered in a group setting. Speaking of "promoters," we are looking for people at ECOG who would be willing to speak to others about Pharos Academy (including friends and businesses passionate about Christian education). We will soon be opening enrollment but at this time, we are looking for partners to help support this ministry through prayers, volunteering and financial support.

One of the reasons we are seeking financial support has to do with paying for legal services. Prior to opening Pharos Academy, it must be incorporated as a Limited Liability Company (LLC) and designated as a 501c3 non-profit corporation. The school will also need to have by-laws and procedures drafted that are compliant with Pennsylvania law. And there are other "legal beagle" matters that need to happen between now and September. At this point, the plan is to retain the services of McKenna-Snyder, LLC, a law firm based in Exton, PA that specializes in education legal services in Pennsylvania. They are willing to help us with all these legal matters.



Maundy Thursday Sacrificial Supper

The Thursday of Holy Week (the week preceding Easter) is called "Maundy Thursday" and occurs on <u>April 17</u> this year. It is the day we commemorate Jesus' Last Supper with His disciples. At <u>7:00 PM</u> on Maundy Thursday, we will be having a "Sacrificial Supper" similar to a sacrificial breakfast. The "supper" will consist of a hot cross bun and bottle of water. Therefore, we recommend you eat a "real" supper at home if you're looking for a hearty meal! The service

will be held in the Fellowship Hall with participants seated at round tables. We will engage in a time of quiet contemplation and reading (to be provided) while we enjoy the hot cross buns and water. Then, we will go into a season of guided prayer where pre-selected participants will read prayers corresponding to Holy Week Events starting with Palm Sunday and ending with Holy Saturday. Following the prayer corresponding to Wednesday, we will celebrate the Ordinance of Feetwashing in Room 1 (for men) and Room 4 (for women). We will gather again at our tables for the Thursday prayer and to celebrate the Lord's Supper. A big "thanks" goes out to our Magnifiers Team for designing this unique, meaningful Maundy Thursday experience. We also want to thank our Administrative Board members for agreeing to prepare the Feetwashing areas and Communion elements. Pharos Academy: What Does "Pharos" Mean?

The Microschool Launch Sub Task Force gave the name "Pharos Academy" to the hybrid Christian classical microschool that will tentatively open at ECOG on September 1 (see the article in this edition of The Sonshine News, "Microschool Launch Sub Task Force Update on p. 9-10). Pharos Academy derives its name from the Greek word "pharos" (φάρος). The Lighthouse of Alexandria, Egypt, one of the Seven Wonders of the World stood on the island of Pharos in the harbor of Alexandria and is said to have been more than 350 feet (110 meters) high; the only taller man-made structures at the time would have been the pyramids of Giza. It was a technological triumph and is the archetype of all lighthouses since (Source: Enclopedia Britannica). The lighthouse was built around 300 B.C. and was still standing until the 12th century A.D.

The Greek word "pharos" spans both the Classical and Koine Greek periods, evolving in meaning over time. During the Classical era (500–323 BCE), it referred to a "plough." By the Koine era (323 BCE–600 CE), however, "pharos" had come to mean "lighthouse," a shift linked to the iconic Lighthouse of Alexandria on Pharos Island.

Pharos Academy also draws its name from two core inspirations. First, we aim to shine as a beacon among educational institutions, collaborating with parents to deliver a classical education marked by excellence, much like a lighthouse guides through the dark. Second, we connect to the Koine Greek era, the language of the New Testament. While "pharos" doesn't appear in the New Testament or the Septuagint—the Greek translation of the Old Testament—the New Testament introduces Apollos, a native of Alexandria, Egypt. Historical records confirm the Lighthouse of Alexandria stood during Apollos' lifetime. In Acts 18:24–28, Apollos is described as an eloquent speaker who boldly taught about Jesus in the Ephesus synagogue, though initially he knew only John's baptism. Priscilla and Aquila refined his understanding, deepening his grasp of God's way. Later, in Achaia, he strengthened believers and skillfully proved from the Scriptures that Jesus was the Christ.

Through Pharos Academy, we will aspire to nurture every student in the same spirit as Apollos, fostering growth in grace and knowledge and teaching them to "honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks" for a reason for the hope that lies within them (1 Peter 3:15).

Finally, if you're wondering, "does any of this connect with ECOG?" The answer is a resounding, "Yes!" Our purpose as a church is to "serve as a Lighthouse of God to guide people to salvation in Jesus Christ. Worship, love, encouragement, and biblical teaching are the foundation by which we prepare people to face the storms of life." As a lighthouse (or "pharos") of God, we are delighted to offer Pharos Academy to families this Fall, God willing!



WHOA! Is the Lead Pastor Really Going to Be on Vacation Easter Sunday?



The answer to the question in this article's title is, "Yes" (seriously, it is, "Yes"). It may seem strange for the pastor of a church to go on vacation over Easter weekend, so some explanation is surely in order. Pastor George and Judi Jensen's niece (Judi's brother's daughter) is getting married on Saturday, April 19 during the evening hours in Charleston, SC. Obviously, pastor and Judi

were invited to the wedding along with other family members. Living Independence for the Elderly

Local Program Offers Seniors an Alternative to Nursing Facility

The Lamplighters recently met with Mary Lynn Hawk, a representative from Albright Life Center to hear about an alternative for seniors who want to stay in their home versus going to a nursing home. Their program called LIFE (Living Independence for the Elderly) is for those with Medicare, Medicaid, or both or you can also pay privately. To qualify for the program you must:

- Be 55 or older
- Live in the service area of a LIFE organization (this local office covers Cumberland and Perry Counties)
- Need a nursing home level of care (as certified by the state)
- Be able to live safely in the community with help from LIFE

The program covers all the care and services covered by Medicare and Medicaid if authorized by a health care team who will make an assessment. This includes medications, assistance with daily living, social services, transport to the LIFE center (on Good Hope Rd.) for activities or medical appointments, and much more! If interested, there are pamphlets on the table in the living room or for more information or for a tour of the center, contact Mary Lynn Hawk at (717) 557-6181.
