Shine Without Wax

How sincere are you, really? How honest, dependable, and genuine? These are traits that shape our character and help others see Christ in us.

The word *sincere* comes from an old Latin phrase meaning "without wax." In ancient Rome, potters sometimes used wax to hide cracks in flawed pottery. Buyers would hold each piece up to the sunlight to see if it was truly solid and not hiding any imperfections.

When we allow the light of Christ to shine through our lives, it reveals both our rough spots and our strengths. The good news is that Jesus never shames us for the cracks; he restores us. As his light works within us, we grow into people of integrity who are whole, authentic, and sincerely his.

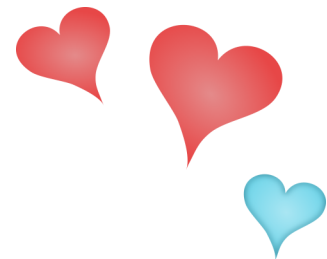


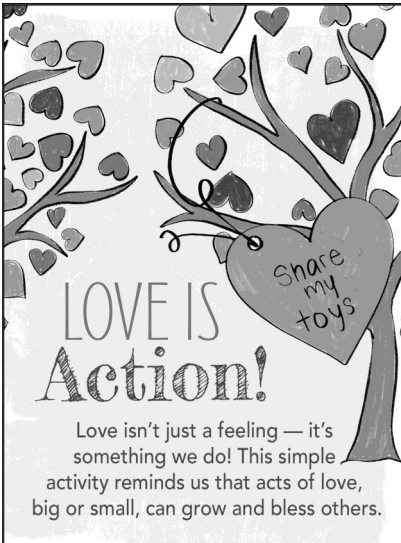

Mountain-Top Moments

In Matthew 17, we read a remarkable story about Jesus taking Peter, James and John up a high mountain. What seemed like an ordinary hike turned into a moment that changed their understanding of who Jesus really is. Matthew writes, “And He was transfigured before them; and His face shone like the sun, and His garments became as white as light” (Matthew 17:2, NASB). The disciples saw Jesus in a brilliant, heavenly glory — a glimpse of his true identity as the Son of God.

But that wasn’t all. A voice from the cloud declared, “This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him!” (Matthew 17:5, NASB). Imagine the awe and holy fear those disciples felt. Just like many of us would, they fell to the ground, overwhelmed by God’s presence. Yet Jesus didn’t leave them trembling. He came close, touched them and said those comforting words we all long to hear: “Do not be afraid.”

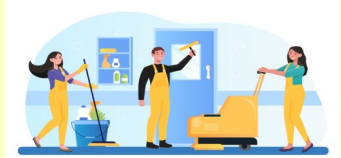
After the moment passed, Jesus led them back down the mountain and into everyday life again. This powerful encounter reminds us that Jesus is truly the Son of God — radiant, holy and worthy of our worship. But it also shows us his heart: gentle, reassuring and near to us when we are afraid.

We may not stand on that mountain, but we can still experience our own “mountain-top moments” — times in worship, prayer or Scripture when we glimpse God’s glory in a fresh way. And just like the disciples, we are invited to rise up, follow Jesus and listen to him every step of the journey.

“MAJORING IN THE MINORS”



In February, Pastor Jensen will begin a Sunday morning message series focusing on the Old Testament Minor Prophets entitled, “Majoring in the Minors.” There are 12 books in the Old Testament from the so-called “minor prophets.” We consider them to be minor prophets since their books are much shorter than those of the major prophets. However, the minor prophets give us insight into some major matters of faith and practice including the character and nature of our God. The series features one message from each of the Minor Prophets, each highlighting a central theme from that prophet's book. Below is a list of the prophets, messages, themes and scripture passages we will cover.

Hosea: Our God is a Faithful God
“God is Faithful When We Are Disgraceful” – Hosea 3:1-5

Zephaniah: Our God Wants Us to Seek Him
“Take a Look in the Right Direction” – Zephaniah 2:1-3

Zechariah: Our God is Victorious Yet Humble
“He’s Coming and He’s Not Horsing Around” – Zechariah 9:9-10

Jonah: Our God is a God of Miracles
“A Lot Can Change in Three Days” – Jonah 1:1-17

Haggai: Our God Presses Us to Be Diligent in Kingdom Duties
“Let’s Roll Up Our Sleeves and Get to Work!” – Haggai 1:1-15

Malachi: Our God Wants Solid, Spiritual Leaders

6. You all have a special needs ministry... THAT IS SO AWESOME!

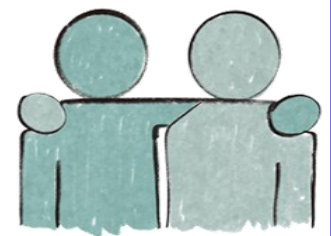


A SUPPORT GROUP IS AVAILABLE AT ECOG!

MICROSCHOOL LAUNCH SUB TASK FORCE UPDATE

On Monday, January 12, 2026, the Microschool Launch Sub Task Force met to at Enola First Church of God to continue getting things in order for the opening of Pharos Academy in 2026.

We continue to move forward with establishing Pharos Academy's 501c3 non-profit status by largely doing the work on our own. Kathy Liddick was able to glean some valuable information from Frank Arva, the Financial Secretary of the Churches of God Eastern Regional Conference. Frank retired from the IRS, so he knows his stuff. He recommended the names of some accounting and legal resources for us when and if we need them.

We continue to raise funds through the "1-100 Wall Envelope Fundraiser" which will soon be moved upstairs in an effort to generate new interest. Donation envelopes continue to be used by some folks on a regular basis. The Pharos Display Table located in the Living Room will be taken down and then set back up in the future with a new look. Lauren Cook and Joni Wolfe will be scheduling another Panera Bread fundraiser in February. They are looking into other restaurants to hold similar fundraisers.

We reported last month that we are looking into tweaking Pharos Academy's structure to make it more financially feasible without the aid of EITC funds. Jill Kilker is investigating Meadow Hill Homeschool Center near Carlisle, PA which offers unique learning options for parents and students. It appears that Meadow Hill has found a way to operate a hybrid home school microschool without using EITC funds. There may be much we can learn from this school.

Jill also encouraged the Task Force to look online at "Acton Academy." Though not specifically Christian, it is a nation-wide franchise modeled similar to what we envision for Pharos Academy. It appears that we could make Pharos Academy an Acton Academy affiliate that is thoroughly Christian (Acton Campuses often use their own unique name and some are 100% Christian). Using an Acton franchise could save us in administrative and business costs.

Pastor Jensen is in contact with Grace Alliance Academy. This is a small hybrid Christian Microschool that meets in the Mount Eaton Church in Saylorsburg, PA. We may be able to glean some ideas from Grace Alliance and the Mount Eaton Church.

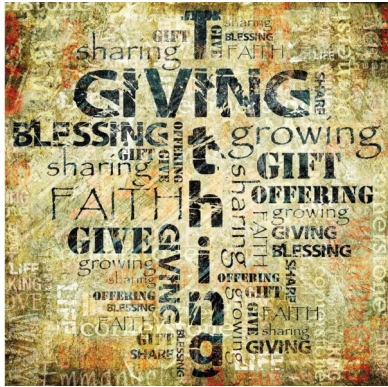

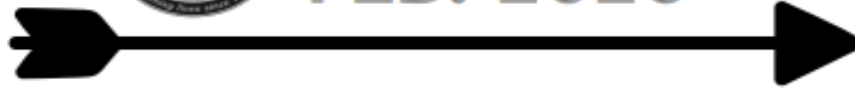
